Write a letter to the author of your summer reading book telling them how you feel about the book. Ask the author at least three questions.	Read your summer reading book to an adult and discuss any parts you don't understand.	Make a word web of your summer reading characters.	Rewrite your summer reading book as a graphic novel.	Find a place in your book where a character makes an important choice. Write a paragraph about how the book would change if the character had made a different choice.
Read another book by your summer reading author just for fun.	Redesign the cover of your summer reading book.	Make a dictionary of words you were unfamiliar with from your summer reading book.	Make a Venn Diagram to compare your summer reading book to a book you had read previously.	Come up with a new ending for your summer reading book.
Make an advertisement for something in your summer reading book.	Write a sentence about your book starting with each letter of the alphabet. You will have 26 sentences, but you may have to get creative with X!	FREE	Write a paragraph about how the book you read for summer reading will affect your life.	Pretend you joined the main character of your summer reading book for a day. Write a journal article all about your day.
Draw a detailed map of your summer reading book's setting. Include a map key and map date.	Write and illustrate a sequel to your summer reading book.	Listen to an audiobook by your summer reading author.	Write a short story about characters from your summer reading book.	Make a collage about your summer reading book.
Reread your summer reading book.	Look up information about the author of your summer reading book and write a paragraph about their career.	Write an epilogue to your summer reading book fast-forwarding to 5 years from the ending.	Write a poem about your summer reading book.	Make a timeline of your summer reading book.

As in "real" BINGO, there are also other ways you can win. There are 12 different ways to BINGO: horizontal, vertical, and diagonal lines.

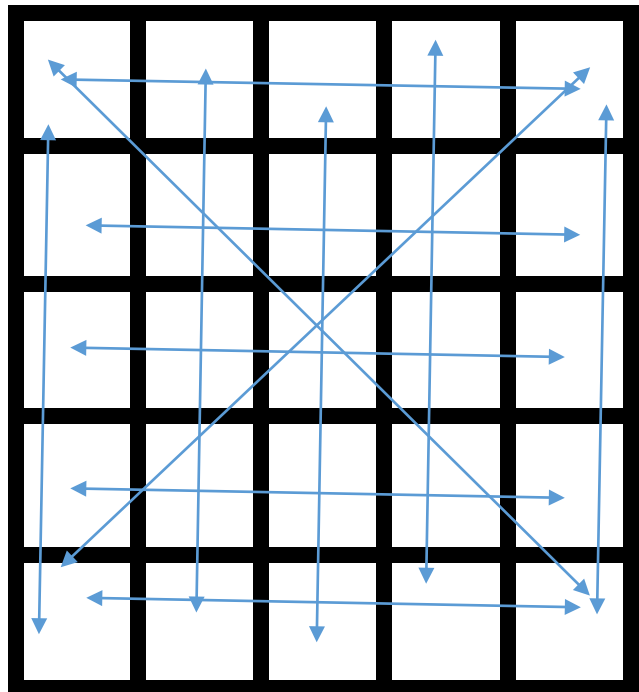
Definitions of BINGO
